It is 1983 and Cristiano has just turned 10. He is in love with TV shows, and he dances "Cicale" in front of the TV, mesmerised by Heather Parisi whom he tries to imitate. He feels different from everyone, and very soon the school becomes a nightmare place that suffocates and hurts him. Only Delia, his young aunt who lives in absolute freedom and hosts him for the summer on the island of Ischia, really understands him. She is the one who starts calling him Crilù and who urges him to search for his true self. During this holiday, Cristiano also meets Yu, a young Chinese girl with whom he will forge a deep and lifesaving friendship. He will meet her again a few years later in Bologna, a city that will finally allow him to breathe a new air, different from the claustrophobic atmosphere of the small town where he grew up. Here, the awareness of his true identity will begin to make its way within him. "We are shining stars" is a choral novel in which the vicissitudes of multi-faceted characters intertwine with the events of the LGBT movement, with the first protests in Bologna, with the claiming of natural rights, and with the unforgettable music of the Eighties that serves as a fil rouge for the entire narrative. A journey in which Crilù will be surrounded by a queer and bohemian community, united and courageous, that will lead him to understand that another world is possible.


VITTORIA SCHISANO

FRANCESCA LA MANTIA ANGELO URGO A MAN WITHOUT FEAR

D'Artagnan, the first journalist "suicided" by the Mafia

There are stories that we need to keep telling. Like that of Cosimo Cristina, a young man everyone knew as D'Artagnan. He was in his early twenties, lived in Termini Imerese (Sicily), and was a journalist. He denounced the Mafia with courage.

D'Artagnan, born Cosimo Cristina, is a promise of Sicilian journalism. He lives in Termini Imerese, a land at the mercy of an unnamed and silent Mafia. Cosimo is the first to write about it, and he does it with stubbornness. There are some who detest him and some who threaten him. They call him D'Artagnan because of the goatee he wears and because of his extravagant and unconventional way of dressing. He collaborates with the most important Italian newspapers and eventually he founds his own: Prospettive Siciliane. Then, on the 5th of May 1960, D'Artagnan is found dead along the railway tracks. He is only 25 years old. The case is immediately dismissed as suicide. However, five years later his best friend, an art critic as well as the brother of a famous general of the Carabinieri, feels a great weight on his conscience. He is convinced that Cosimo did not commit suicide and decides to contact the only people he believes can help him to shed light on the case: Cosimo's fiancée, Enza, and the Deputy Commissioner of Palermo, Angelo Mangano. Thus begins the search for an inconvenient truth, to clear the name of a fearless young man who considered journalism not just a privilege, but a duty. A story that, even today, it is important to narrate, so that we do not forget the courage of someone who tried to change things and to fight a monster that many people cannot even pronounce: the Mafia.

Alto Volta, 1961. For his birthday, little Thomas Sankara receives a red bicycle, sparkling like hot coals. Radiant, he immediately tries it, but a group of white boys attack him and try to take it away from him. His reaction immediately shows his temper and how, from a very young age, the ideals of equality and freedom are rooted in him. Thus begins the story, in a fictional way, of the life of the charismatic President of Burkina Faso, who, at the age of 37, was assassinated for his anti-imperialist and anti-colonialist ideas. Famous for his speech at the ONU in 1984, Sankara was a fervent pacifist who personally fought for the rights of the least and the women of his country. A man of rare culture, he was direct, hated diplomacy and renounced all the personal privileges that his position could offer him. In just four years he built hundreds of schools, roads, hospitals and managed to guarantee two meals and a liter of water a day to each of the Burkinabè. He called it: the Revolution of Happiness. "We will have been successful only if, looking around us, we can say that our people are a little happier." On the day of the first anniversary of his Revolution, Sankara changed the name of his nation, a legacy of the European partition of Africa: he called it Burkina Faso, which in the local language means *The land of whole men*.

ANTONIO GENTILE

Antonio Gentile was born in Pescara in 1975. He is an engineer and his passion for writing led him in 2014 to publish his first novel, I cavalli delle giostre, an introspective work with which he won numerous literary competitions including the "Carver Prize" and the "Premio InediTO - Colline di Torino" The Land of Whole Men, the historical novel about the life of Thomas Sankara, is the first novel with La Corte.



The case of the murder of Monica, a young painter, has been a cold case for years: the culprit has never been found. But now new elements are emerging, and Inspector Alba Leone decides to return to the investigation. In fact, Monica's sister has discovered hidden, anamorphic images in her paintings that can only be seen when looking at them from a certain angle. They look like clues to be deciphered, which could lead to the discovery of the murderer. Each painting is a tile in a mosaic to be reconstructed, one that might finally reveal the culprit. To uncover the truth, Alba seeks help from the former policeman in charge, at the time, of the investigation - Alex Nero, who is currently dealing with a murder that has just been committed. In this case, too, a girl, a university student, was killed. And it is indeed the possible suspect, a professor who was dating the girl and found her dead in her apartment, who hires him, claiming to be innocent.

What is really behind the choice of conscientious objection, and how much a society in which the stigma of guilt is still very strong can truly be considered democratic and free?




